They are back! If you have been enjoying the cemetery on a recent sunny day, you've probably seen Dave Pinyeard and Bernadette Neiderer from Historic Preservation Northwest hard at work, repairing broken and toppled grave markers. Out of the over 2,500 tombstones in the cemetery, they have identified 155 historic grave markers and monuments in need of repair. In part, through the generosity of donors, the EMCA has been able to contract with them for repair of 54 of these. Only 101 to go!
