

Kara Eubanks has a solo, teaching and ensemble career that has taken her all over the world. She has played with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago and the Chamber Orchestra in Paris, among others.

Dr. Eubanks is the director of the Willamette Violin Academy where she teaches violin and music theory She also serves on the music faculty at the University of Oregon. Last year, she brought some of her young students to perform at the Masonic Cemetery's other music series, *Music To Die For*.

She holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in violin performance from the Graduate Center of the City University of New York. She also holds a Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degree from Northern Illinois University, where she studied under Mathias Tacke, Shmuel Ashkenasi, and the Vermeer Quartet.

Nathalie Fortin is a pianist and collaborative musician based in Eugene. Originally from Montreal, Canada, she holds degrees from the Conservatoire de Musique de Montréal, the Eastman School of Music, and the University of Southern California.

She will accompany Kara on keyboard.

As you probably noticed, the name of this concert is Bits and Pieces. It will feature music by Mozart, Brahms, Kabalevsky, Wieniawski, Kreisler, and a few popular surprises.
